
Have you ever considered enrolling your child(ren) in a Cub Scout or BSA program?



Units that have high recruitment and retention year over year do the following:

- Have succession planning for the top unit positions.
- Make a program plan over the summer.
- Have a program calendar before the program year begins with coordinators (non-leaders) assigned for each pack event/activity.
- Share the program calendar during recruitment and at the first unit meeting.
- Communicate what they expect of parents.
- Are intentional about welcoming everyone.
