



Other Bobcat Ideas

Popsicle Stick Puzzles- Write each piece of the Oath and Law on individual popsicle sticks and have Scouts try to line them up in the correct order. If making multiple sets use different colored markers so you can easily tell which stick belongs to each set.

Mega Blocks Tower- Write each piece of the Oath and Law on Mega Blocks/Legos (or masking tape on blocks) and have Scouts build a tower in the correct order.

Emoji Match- Especially great for young Scouts who don't read yet, use note cards or a poster with emojis that represent each part of the Oath and Law. They will learn to associate the picture with the word and have it memorized in no time.

Pictionary- Write each part of the Scout Law on a piece of paper and place it into a hat/bucket. Have each Scout choose a piece of paper and then draw what that word means to them. After Scouts are finished, have them show their drawing to the Den one at a time and see if the Scouts can guess which word they chose. This is a fun activity to re-do every year to see how their perspective changes for different parts of the Law.

Bobcat Relay- Scouts start at 1 end of the room and a Leader or Parent is at the other. Scouts run/walk/dance/hop etc. one at a time to the Leader. Depending on your group size this can be done as teams or individually. Roll a dice to have them answer their "quiz question" 1) Say the Scout Oath 2) Say the Scout Law 3) Cub Scout Motto 4) Cub Scout Sign 5) Cub Scout Handshake 6) Cub Scout Salute. If they answer correctly they can move back to the other end of the room. If they can't get the answer, have them roll again or give them hints. (Remember the age of Scouts with this game. Tigers may need extra hints where AOLs should know every answer)

Additional variation: AOL can answer with differences between Cub Scouts and Scouts BSA.
